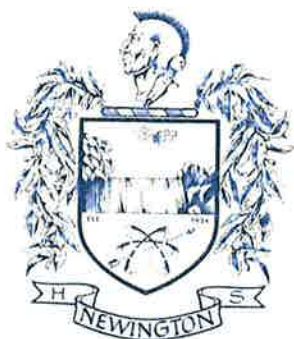

Curricula

Sequential courses are available in all college preparatory subjects and in a board-range of Fine Arts and Career/ Technical course electives. The lab science courses are Biology, AP/UConn Biology, Botany, Human Anatomy and Physiology, Chemistry, AP Chemistry, Physics, AP Physics, Marine Biology and AP Environmental Sciences, Matter and Motion, Forensic Science, Personalized Medicine and Genomics, Environmental Science, Physical/Earth Science

Advanced Placement Examinations

In May 2019, 548 AP examinations in 20 different subject areas were administered. 72% of the scores were three or higher. The total number of AP Scholars is 86.

GPA Rank Distribution

Class rank is cumulative from grade nine and determined by the final grades at the end of the year using a weighted four-point system.

Students can elect to exclude non-core (Art, CTE, Music) elective classes from their cumulative GPA. This can only be done for courses taught at the College Prep level. Courses that are weighted at the Honors or AP/ECE levels cannot be excluded from GPA.
